

It has been some time since we surveyed the membership for what you want to learn, so this is your opportunity to give input as to the direction that the programs and newbie workshops take this year. Come to the August meeting with ideas and suggestions for the program committee that is led by Nan Kirby. And to inspire the rest of us, bring any work that you have been working on over the summer. Let's make the theme of the day "This summer I ...".

This summer we (the guild) had an incredible workshop put on by Nan Kirby on fabric collage. She had everything that you could have imagined needing and more that you did not even know existed. She shared new techniques that can be applied not only to fabric collage, but to the more "traditional" form of calligraphic art on paper and other surfaces. I highlight the word traditional, because we are artists. There is the world of the "not yet attempted" that is calling, even if it is only your personal new item. Lettering and communication in general can and should take many forms. As Nan said "You are only limited by what you cannot think of". Therefore exposure to other forms of art and communication are essential to develop into a mature (notice I did not say old) artist.

June Baty tangled with us again in July. She calls Zentangle a contemplative art form. As such, it is good for the soul as well as the eyes. There are beautiful pieces of art created from informed doodling. Zentangle has become very popular and is offered in many places almost every week. Just ask June where you can attend your next therapy session.

Harvey's Helpful Hints



Rubber Stamps

Make your own rubber stamps using Dr. Scholl's shoe liner. Cut out the design and cement it to a wooden block or an empty film canister for a rolling pattern.

Less Fiber

Baby wipes are great for wiping ink and paint off hands, fingers and work surfaces.

Get an Edge

Cement the serrated tear strips from Saran Wrap boxes to the backside of a ruler for tearing paper. Makes a handy tool, but be careful - those edges are sharp.

Do-Dads

If you are uncertain about adding any additions to your artwork such as spirals, flourishes, do-dads, flowers, etc. make a trial of the addition(s) on tracing paper and place them on top of (or underneath) the art piece to see if they will add to the aesthetics or detract from the piece. This can be very useful rather than inserting them without the trial and find they detract

from your art and have to redo the piece.

Brush Often

To avoid ink build-up on your nibs - cement an old toothbrush head to the inside of a wide mouth jar (with screw-on lid). Fill with water and when needed just swipe the nib on the toothbrush head. Cleans the nib instantly. Screw on the lid and you can take it to a workshop or meeting.

Sugar and Spice

For a star-like effect sprinkle salt onto wet letters. When dry just brush off the salt. And for a mossy effect do the same using sugar. No telling what might emerge!

Wide Marker

Need a wide felt marker for posters and large signs? Disassemble a chalkboard eraser and use the top part as your writing tool!

Reservoir

Try using a Mitchell reservoir on a copperplate nib for extended flourishing. You might be surprised.

Perforate

Make perforations on pads and cards that you want to tear apart using a pounce wheel (available at fabric stores). Run the wheel along a ruler, but be sure to protect the table underneath...the teeth are razor sharp.

NOTE: We stock many vintage nibs, handmade pen staffs and have calligraphic DVD's available at the meetings. The vintage nibs are increasingly difficult to obtain since they are not made any longer. And now we offer our penstaffs "to your specifications" - you choose the shaft length, size and nib holder to accommodate your special nib. Just let me know your preferences by email or phone and we'll have them at the next meeting.

The May program



